Buckinghamshire LEP Capital Programme Summary

- 1.1 **Getting Building Fund (GBF)** The Bucks LEP Getting Building Fund grant allocation of £7.7m was fully committed and spent on the approved priority projects before 31st March 2022, in line with government expectations. This grant leveraged initial private investment of £14.7m, a match ratio of 2 to 1 private to public sector funding, generating a total programme value of approximately £22.4m. The programme continues to develop, with many of the projects already delivering against the key performance criteria.
- 1.2 GBF programme impacts to Sept 2022, reported 25th November 2022.

Local Growth Fund (LGF) – The Bucks LEP LGF grant allocation of approx. £60.1m was allocated to Bucks LEP in three competitive rounds of funding as part of the National Growth Deal, between 2014/15 to 2016/17. The full LGF grant has been fully committed and spent within the 5-year funding window, on project priorities to be completed by end March 2021, in compliance with the LEP national assurance framework. The LGF grant has leveraged a total private and other public sector investment of over £151m during the life of the programme, generating a total programme value of approximately £212m.

In addition, Buckinghamshire LEP supported the Buckinghamshire County Council bid for the South East Aylesbury Link Road (SEALR) during LGF3, securing a total of approx. £13.47m LGF towards this strategic road link for Aylesbury, also a major mitigation against impact of the HS2 Rail Project. The delivery of this scheme is being managed in partnership with the Council through the DfT Retain scheme process. Funds retained by the DfT until Full Scheme Business Case is approved, which is anticipated to be later in 2023.

The programme continues to develop, with many of the projects already delivering against the key performance criteria. More complex major projects such as the Aylesbury Eastern Link Road and South East Aylesbury Link Road (DfT Retained) are subject to ongoing delivery and full benefits and impacts of these schemes therefore not likely to deliver anticipated benefits and impacts until 2028 or later.
