

Buckinghamshire Local Enterprise Partnership continues to be one of the top performing LEP's in the country, supported by incredible enthusiasm from business, a dedicated Chair and board of directors, and a great team.

This year we have seen a flurry of projects come to fruition right across Buckinghamshire. We're on track to unlock delivery of around £300 million of total investment in Buckinghamshire that will fundamentally improve our economy and future-proof our infrastructure. And, as we reflect on progress to date, it's important that we continue to be ambitious and aspirational for Buckinghamshire.

Our economy faces an exciting future, and Bucks LEP and our partners are working hard to make sure we maximise the potential for business growth across the county.



WHO ARE WE?





GROWING A STRONG AND SUCCESSFUL ECONOMY

Buckinghamshire's economy goes from strength to strength. Our businesses have the 4th highest productivity rates in the country with the GVA (Gross Value Added) per hour worked more than 10% above the national average significantly better than our neighbouring areas in Bedfordshire, Oxfordshire and Hertfordshire. In addition, Buckinghamshire has the highest employment rate in the Oxford-Cambridge Arc at 82 percent compared with the 75 percent for England.

GOOD GROWTH PUTS BUCKS LEP AT THE TOP



Good Growth for Cities 2019 index has placed Bucks LEP as the second highest performing LEP area in England. We are delighted to be rated as a top area for the most improved and overall ranking for good growth. Being located at the heart of the Oxford-Cambridge Arc we recognise that the strength in this region comes from collaboration across city, town and rural areas. That is why three LEPs (Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and South East Midlands) and the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority are working together to use our trailblazing Local Industrial Strategies as the basis for a combined economic vision to support future investment and good growth.



But we are not complacent and we continue to support our high potential businesses and key growth sectors to flourish and grow further and access new national and international markets.

Buckinghamshire is home to iconic business brands and locations: Pinewood Studios, the National Film and Television School, Silverstone, the National Space Propulsion Facility (at Westcott Venture Park) and Stoke Mandeville Hospital, the birthplace of the Paralympic Movement, along with businesses such as Bosch, McAfee, ESRI, Martin Baker, and Cisco.

It has a highly productive economy with a dynamic and resilient employment base underpinned by a strong and high-quality SME business community. Our grammar schools lead the way in the best performing schools' system in the country, Buckinghamshire is a draw for talent, with evidence showing we have the best educated workforce in the land.



Our purpose-built business Growth Hub, Buckinghamshire Business First, is a major strength. Representing a membership of over 11,000 businesses including almost 70% of the local private sector workforce. Buckinghamshire Business First is helping make Bucks one of the best places to start, run and grow a new business.

We are vital in delivering the national growth agenda, all the evidence suggests that Buckinghamshire, like many other county economies, although rural and without a city, remains a critically important investment channel in underpinning economic growth and national industrial strategy.

NEW ECONOMIC PLAN TO SUPER-CHARGE BUCKS



A new economic blueprint for Bucks, designed to grow the area's creative, space, advanced manufacturing and digital health capability on the world stage, has been unveiled. As one of the first trailblazing Local Industrial Strategies in the country, the strategy will drive the Buckinghamshire economy to further increase innovation, support international trade, improve connectivity and set out how the area will maximise the economic opportunities of the Oxford-Cambridge Arc.

Funding is being invested in better transport links, business and innovation space, education facilities and technology:















INCREASING PROSPERITY AND GROWTH — LOCAL GROWTH FUND

Bucks is a major wealth generator for the UK economy, and the commitment of over £73m in Local Growth Funds is unleashing ambition and creativity across the county. This funding is enabling the delivery of new road and rail infrastructure, better skills and business opportunities and enhancing digital connectivity to support sustainable economic growth in Buckinghamshire. The Local Growth Fund grant has leveraged over £119m match funding generating a capital programme value of over £192 million.

There's certainly plenty to shout about, in the past 12 months our Local Growth Fund investment has helped support new educational facilities at the world-leading National Film and Television School, new facilities for the creative industries and construction and motor trades have been created at the Buckinghamshire College Group sites, and the new Vinson Centre for Entrepreneurship at the University of Buckingham, along with investment in infrastructure projects such as High Wycombe Town Centre Master Plan and the A355 Improvement Scheme. This performance in our Local Growth Fund has enabled Bucks LEP to be graded 'excellent' for delivery in the Government's annual assessment of Local Enterprise Partnerships — one of only four LEPs to achieve this!

PUSH OFF FOR HIGH-PERFORMANCE CYCLING CENTRE



Bucks LEP invested £2m of its Local Growth Funds in the development of a new 2,415 sq. m. state-of-the-art sports engineering innovation centre. Situated in Bucks LEP's Silverstone Enterprise Zone, the Silverstone Sports Engineering Hub, which is owned by TotalSim Ltd, will establish a research, development and business incubation centre for British high-performance cycling — the first of its kind in the UK.

NEW FUNDING SUPPORTING GROWTH OF BUCKS CREATIVE SECTOR



Buckinghamshire's creative sector is world renowned and we want to do everything we can to support and continue its growth. Bucks LEP were therefore delighted to announced £4 million in funding to support three new initiatives – 'The National Centre for Immersive Storytelling', 'School of Computing and Centre for Al' and 'Bucks Creates @ Pinewood' – to strengthen and build Buckinghamshire's creative sector, a key growth driver of the local economy.

INVESTMENT SECURES NEW ROAD LINK FOR HIGH WYCOMBE TOWN CENTRE



Bucks LEP Local Growth Funding of £8.48 million completes a new £15m road link through the Town Centre, boosting regeneration potential, unlocking hundreds of high quality new homes, and commercial and retail opportunities. Work started on first phase of the scheme in 2015 to improve accessibility, public realm, address local congestion and traffic movement through the town centre. The final phase through the old gas works site is due to be completed late 2019. This outstanding collaboration with local authorities and developer Inland Homes has transformed the town centre paving the way for future investment and regeneration plans in High Wycombe.

FIRING UP MAJOR INVESTMENT — GROWING PLACES FUND

Bucks LEP is investing, recycling and re-investing its £8.1m Growing Places Fund on projects that offer great returns for Bucks on jobs, business critical infrastructure and growth.

We have already demonstrated our ability to deliver an ambitious programme. 100% of our Growing Places Funding has been used to kick-start the regeneration of the town centres and access gateways in Aylesbury and High Wycombe, as well as supporting skills, tourism and Bucks LEP's wider growth programmes.

EUROPEAN FUNDING CONTINUES TO SECURE JOBS AND GROWTH IN BUCKS

The 2014 to 2020 European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF) bring the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), European Social Fund (ESF) and part of the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD) together into a single Growth Programme for England. This supports our key growth priorities of innovation, research and development, support for small and medium sized enterprises, low carbon, skills, employment, and social inclusion.

Businesses and communities across Buckinghamshire have benefited from $\pounds 10.9m$ of European funding, secured by Bucks LEP, for growth and jobs. Projects supported by this funding include:



Skills Brokerage Service

Identifying training opportunities to increase the productivity of over 1,000 Buckinghamshire based businesses.



Low Carbon Workspaces

Awards grants between £1,000 and £5,000 to help small to medium sized business enterprises (SME) in Buckinghamshire install energy saving projects.



Rural Funding

Awards to support the development and diversification in our rural and tourism businesses.





A SNAPSHOT OF OUR YEAR

Buckinghamshire Local Enterprise Partnership is an enabling body which seeks to create a business-friendly environment in which organisations can succeed. We have worked with our partners to identify an approach for directing and prioritising our activity and achieving improved business productivity. As a result of this approach, we have achieved great success during 2018/19.




A CELEBRATION OF BUSINESS IN THE ENTREPRENEURIAL HEART OF BRITAIN

Our Business Growth Hub is the envy of almost every Local Enterprise Partnership in England and it has been another successful year for top performing Buckinghamshire Business First. There's plenty to shout about, having delivered £2.8 million in grants to businesses, 35,131 instances of information and assistance being provided to businesses, and facilitated 580 new jobs through their activity over the past 12 months. DELIVERY PARTNERSHIPS

Buckinghamshire Advantage, our joint delivery vehicle, has bridged the gap between public and private sectors. Its mission is to identify new opportunities, remove barriers to sustainable development and add value to planned development by promoting growth.

Buckinghamshire Advantage has accelerated the development and delivery of a variety of projects and schemes, including the Aylesbury Woodlands mixed use development covering over 200ha of employment led development to the east of Aylesbury, providing much needed new road infrastructure and supporting the growth of the Aylesbury Garden Town programme.

Buckinghamshire Advantage has also enabled the Handy Cross development in High Wycombe and the Aylesbury Waterside, and is now pumping investment into our Enterprise Zone sites.

ENTERPRISE ZONES TAKING BUCKS BEYOND THE FINAL FRONTIER



Since 2016 Enterprise Zone status has provided an enormous boost to help Buckinghamshire grow our existing businesses and attract and accelerate new investment in key business sectors at our three strategically important Enterprise Zone sites.

The scale and special nature of the development, the mix of uses and the highly strategic position, at the heart of the 'Golden Triangle' and the 'Oxford to Cambridge Arc' enables the Aylesbury Vale Enterprise Zone sites to compete internationally as major new employment locations.

The Aylesbury Vale Enterprise Zone is one of the fastest growing in the UK, having delivered over 24,000 sq m of employment space in its first three years of operation. The pace of development is set to increase with a total of 50,000 sq m. planned to be delivered by April 2020 rising to 70,000 sq m. by April 2021.

The sites at Silverstone Park, Westcott Venture Park and at Aylesbury Woodlands are driving forward the Buckinghamshire economy in the sectors of high-performance engineering, space technology and life sciences — all critical to the national economy and just as importantly securing business rate returns to be reinvested into the local business community.

Working with our Enterprise Zone partners – MEPC, Rockspring and DB Symmetry - there are currently exciting investment and development opportunities across all of our sites.



At Silverstone the first phase of the Enterprise Zone, consisting 11,600 sq m. of new employment space, built by MEPC, is now full attracting businesses of the calibre of Virgin Racing, the World Champion Mercedes-AMG Petronas Formula 1 Team, David Brown Automotive and Twintec Baumont. £5m of retained business rates has been invested into a new multiutility trench to advance the development of future phases of development, and a further £2m of Local Growth Funding has been committed to develop a new Innovation Centre providing business access to the UK's premier aerodynamics facility for racing cycles and sports equipment.



At Westcott a mixture of UK Government, UK Space Agency and European Funding has been secured to create a new vibrant centre for space propulsion testing and development. New facilities include a 5G test centre for unmanned automated vehicles, being managed by the Satellite Application Catapult, alongside incubation facilities for businesses operating in the sector. Reaction Engines' landmark testing facility for the ground-breaking SABRE engine will be completed later this year and work is commencing on the UK Space Agency's Innovation Centre for rocket propulsion. All this activity puts Westcott at the heart of the UK's Space Sector.



Aylesbury Woodlands will form one of the largest new employment sites in the south of England. The Aylesbury Woodlands development was key to Aylesbury securing Garden Town Status and will help deliver the Eastern Link road, a vital element in the transport infrastructure needed for the growth in Aylesbury and beyond. The Aylesbury Woodlands site will also provide the opportunity to develop over 1,100 homes, including 160 custom built housing units, providing a template for a viable alternative to the major housing developers. Most recently at Aylesbury Woodlands construction has commenced on over 23,225 sq. m. of new employment floorspace.

New entrepreneurial companies are an essential component of the vibrant innovation ecosystem needed in Buckinghamshire and Bucks LEP are keen to support and encourage the development of new companies working in high value businesses sectors. The new Westcott Business Incubation Centre located in the Westcott Venture Park and part of Bucks LEP's Enterprise Zone, provides incubation support for early-stage businesses and entrepreneurs looking to develop in rocket propulsion, 5G or autonomous systems.

ENSURING BUSINESSES HAVE THE RIGHT SKILLED WORKFORCE

The Bucks Skills Hub, by working with local schools and colleges, is connecting young people with business to develop a dynamic programme of employer engagement. An effective ecosystem of skills development and careers inspiration is evolving. While the careers inspiration work is broad, there is a focus on our identified growth sectors ensuring that young people's ambitions are aligned to where they will be needed most.

Some recent highlights include: the development of the Bucks Skills Show as the essential event to inform young people about career opportunities; becoming only the second area in the country to have Enterprise Adviser coverage in all secondary schools; development of an extensive apprenticeship support programme - all leading to the Buckinghamshire Careers Hub being recognised as the highest achieving in the country.

Underpinning the skills programme is robust research which proves that exposing young people to at least four encounters with employers during their school career reduces their chances of leaving education or training without a job and increases their earning potential.

LORD AGNEW SEES CAREERS EXCELLENCE IN ACTION




The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, Lord Agnew, at the Department for Education visited Bucks to see first-hand what excellent careers education really looks like. Taking place at the start of National Careers Week, the visit was an opportunity to showcase the fantastic work of Bucks LEP's Skills Hub, which is making excellent progress in Bucks to improve careers awareness and skills development in all our secondary schools. The Skills Hub and its Enterprise Adviser Network (part of the Careers and Enterprise Company's national network) supported 150,000 employer-student encounters in Bucks last year and is home to one of only 20 first wave Careers Hubs in England (another 20 hubs have since been added).

TOP MARKS FOR BUCKS CAREERS



Bucks LEP are delighted by the news that its Buckinghamshire Careers Hub has been recognised as the highest achieving in the country by the Careers and Enterprise Company. The State of the Nation 2019 report, which represents the most comprehensive assessment of careers education in England, placed Bucks LEP as the top performing area for careers provision by achieving the highest average number of Gatsby benchmarks of 4.2 (compared to the national average of 3.0). Bucks LEP's Skills Hub, and its Enterprise Adviser Network, supported over 150,000 employer-student encounters in Bucks in 2018/19, connecting schools and businesses and organising skills competitions in schools with employers including Bosch, East-West Rail and the National Film & Television School - inspiring and informing young people about different careers and developing their work ready skills.





INFRASTRUCTURE FOR GROWTH



Infrastructure investment is essential for the continued delivery of economic growth in Buckinghamshire. That is why Bucks LEP is investing in major transport infrastructure - including the A355 improvement scheme, Aylesbury Eastern Link Road, High Wycombe Southern Transport Scheme and Stoke Mandeville Relief Road - fixing utility constraints that prevent commercial site developments and unblocking major commercial property investments which support the needs of business.

In addition, our involvement in The Greater South East Energy Hub is delivering local energy projects to aid the UK's transition to a low carbon economy, through the provision of renewable energy infrastructure and application of new technologies.

BUCKS THE CENTRE OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP



GROWING OUR PRIORITY SECTORS



We are very excited about developing further collaboration and research capacity within our priority sectors. The iconic locations of Pinewood and Silverstone are now the focus for new business collaboration, along with our vibrant clusters in the fields of high-performance technology and film and creative industries.

For example, a Bucks LEP backed bid, was one of only nine successful applications to receive funding from the Arts and Humanities Research Council to boost the UK's creative sector. The project, pioneered by the Royal Holloway University, will bring together universities, world leading creative and digital businesses. Bucks LEP look forward to helping this vibrant creative cluster develop as leaders in this industry with one of the highest proportions of employment in the sector in the UK with over 17,200 jobs across 4,430 businesses.

We are also working alongside the UK Space Agency to develop the national Space Propulsion test centre in Buckinghamshire and developing integrated healthcare solutions to reduce the burden on our national health service with Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust, Bucks New University and leading technology and lifescience companies.

Developing entrepreneurship is core to Bucks LEP's DNA and the new Vinson Centre for Economics and Entrepreneurship is a vital hub for new innovation and local growth. The new facilities enable the University of Buckingham to grow as one of the country's leading centres for entrepreneurship and enterprise. Bucks LEP is therefore delighted to invest £3m of Local Growth Funds on this key project to create an exciting centre where business and education can interact and build on the University's internationally recognised reputation in pioneering the techniques of entrepreneurship learning.

THE FUTURE IS DIGITAL



Digital connectivity is a critical factor in supporting business growth and effectiveness.

Buckinghamshire has continued to make great strides in improving its digital connectivity, achieving its goal of getting to 95% superfast coverage by December 2019 sixteen months early. The county now has 96% of its premises supplied with superfast coverage, and we continue to put plans in place for further rollout, looking to start delivery on a new £1.8million contract funded by central government in the coming year. We continue to work towards pushing the county towards 100% superfast broadband coverage, and can clearly see the appetite in local communities, as the take-up of the connections provided in contract one is the highest in the UK.

We have also committed to supporting investment in 5G Technology to ensure that Buckinghamshire businesses have the opportunity to enjoy the competitive advantage from being at the leading edge of the next great technological leap forward.

SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE



Bucks Skills Hub continues to work closely to join the dots between businesses and schools and promote the many opportunities available for young people.

The new year will bring a number of opportunities for young people such as STEMRoller - run as part of National Science Week - enabling female students to be inspired by STEM 'roll' models; the NFTS filmmaking challenge; 'Big Bucks' Sales Challenge; APPrentice Challenge run by CloudylT, winners of the CEC SME of the year award; EastWest Rail Challenge; and workplace visits to Pinewood Studios, Flannery Plant Hire to name but a few. The Bucks Skills Show 2020 will again be the showcase event of the year with more meaningful student interactions planned.

In addition, an Apprenticeship Plan for Buckinghamshire will be introduced in early 2020, which places the apprenticeship programme at the centre of the skills programme in the county. The Plan will reflect the role of apprenticeships in helping Buckinghamshire meet its aspirations for a highly skilled workforce, at all ages and levels, and with a focus on its four priority sectors.

The Plan will also reflect and support recommendations emerging from the Skills Advisory Panel research currently being undertaken, working with Buckinghamshire's employer-led sector groups to map apprenticeship schemes to the most 'in demand' occupations over the coming years within Buckinghamshire businesses. A pilot programme will also be underway to develop and implement a model for the brokering of underspent apprenticeship levy funds, to help small businesses create additional apprenticeship opportunities and retain skills funding within the county that would otherwise be lost. The Skills Hub is also leading on the establishment of a local employer group to be supported by the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB), to specifically address training and skills needs in the county.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Buckinghamshire Local Enterprise Partnership board comprises nine local business leaders, one of whom is Chair, and five senior elected members from each of the Buckinghamshire local authorities.

The board provides clear direction and defines priorities for economic development interventions in Buckinghamshire.
